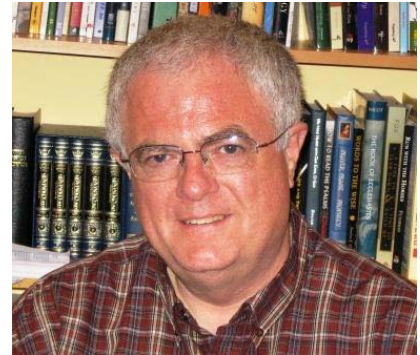




NEW COURSE Launching Fall 2009!

Heritage Seminary is pleased to announce this new course for the Fall 2009 semester. Why is singing so significant for Christian worship? How and why has singing become inseparable from experiential worship? As we sing in a worship setting, what is happening “inside” us – is it worship? Indeed, how has worship come to be thought of almost exclusively in terms of congregational singing? These questions and many others will be addressed as the course explores the dimensions of congregational singing and song and the many layers of meaning experienced by congregants as they sing together. This study is ideal for worship leaders/planners, pastors, and anyone interested in worship music. A musical background is not necessary to take the course.

Dr. Gordon Adnams has been involved in music education and leadership, as well as professional music-making for all his adult life. He has served as a minister of music at Forward Baptist Church in Toronto and Ellerslie Road Baptist Church in Edmonton, and he has taught music at Ontario Bible (now Tyndale University) College and Taylor University College. He earned both B.Mus. and M.Mus. degrees from the University of Toronto, and last year he completed a Ph.D. degree from the University of Alberta, with a dissertation on the topic of this course.
